AspireMed BMAT Course

The AspireMed BMAT Course and the AspireMed Interview Course, both of which will prepare your students for the tough application process and will ensure they have the right skills and practice that they need to excel in the BMAT examination and in their Medical School interviews. The AspireMed BMAT Course will take place on Saturday 22nd October at UCL from 10:00am - 4:00pm.

The course will be taught by professional BMAT teachers who will cover the 3 sections of the BMAT exam thoroughly and ensure the students are equipped with the skills needed to ace the BMAT exam. Throughout the day they will go through mock paper examples, answering techniques and practise questions, the students will also receive a free booklet to aid their revision.

Tickets are currently selling for £25 individually, and for £20 each when purchasing as a group of 3+, which is a lot more affordable compared to most BMAT courses on the market that cost a minimum of £109. Most importantly, all of the proceeds will be going to charity!

It All Adds Up – Booking Opens 10th October

It All Adds Up is the Mathematical Institute’s flagship yearly conference for girls in Years 9-13. The next event will take place on **9th January (Years 9-11) and 10th January (Years 12-13) 2017**. As in previous years, we will have a programme of plenaries, workshops and hands-on maths sessions on all things Mathematics and Statistics. Please note that some sessions may be the same as previous years, so bear that in mind when selecting students to attend.

9th January: Year 9-11

Schools may bring up to 12 students in Years 9-11, but note that Years 9 and 10-11 will follow different programmes, so if you are bringing a mixed group you may need to bring an additional teacher.

10th January: Year 12-13

You can register up to 5 students in Years 12-13, who can attend unaccompanied provided they are over 16. All attendees to this day must be doing Maths at A-level or equivalent.

All bookings need to be received by **17th December** and are allocated on a first come, first served basis. We cannot accept bookings without student names. 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History Masterclass - 19th November 2016

An intensive one-day introduction to some of the key ideas in historiography, for students aged 15-18. *At the History Masterclass, we ask how our views on what history is determine the way in which history is studied, and crucially the lessons which we, as individuals and as societies, take from such study. Should we view history, as Thomas Carlyle would have it, as a mere distillation of rumor or as G.W.F. Hegel would argue, an inexorable progression towards enlightened self-understanding?*

The Masterclass begins with a seminar examining the work of four of the most influential thinkers in historiography. We engage in close reading of some fascinating passages from Nietzsche, Marx, Von Ranke and Collingwood, asking students to engage critically with assumptions underlying the arguments, and to consider the consequences and implications of such positions. Drawing on this material, and on their own experience, students engage with question of whether history should, or can, be objective, factual, entertaining, artistic or some combination of these qualities.

We will look further at the different ways that history has been viewed and studied across the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, from the British Whigs, who regarded history as a neat progression towards the ideal of parliamentary democracy, to Marx's assertion that 'the history of all hitherto existing society is the history of class struggles', and the Annalists' rejection of political narrative in favour of a broader history aiming at the recovery of past 'mentalities' and long-term trends via the tools of social science.

Bringing together historical debates and contemporary politics, the day will close with a seminar debate on responses to the destruction of antiquities in Syria and Iraq. Should we intervene militarily to protect historical treasures? Or is it ethical to purchase antiquities which we have good reason to believe have been looted, if we thereby protect them from harm, or from being absorbed into illegal private collections? We will also discuss the responsibilities of nations to conserve or return the artefacts of other cultures and states.
